

## **MIDDLE SCHOOL/REPEAT HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT**

According to WV State Board Policy 2510 students in 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades who take a high school level course (such as Spanish I) will receive high school credit. As a result, the grade the student receives in this course is transferred and counted in the high school grade point average (GPA) and will be shown on all official transcripts.

If the course is repeated the student and parents, along with consultation from the Principal and Guidance Counselor, can decide to replace the lower grade with the grade from the repeated course in determining final GPA's. All courses shall be shown on any official transcript.

A course may only be repeated once under this policy.

The following requirements shall also apply:

- The course shall be repeated the following semester.
- The next level of the course (i.e. Spanish II) cannot be taken in conjunction with the preceding level (i.e. Spanish I)
- The level of mastery of the subject matter, as demonstrated by the student, shall be the determining factor in permitting a course to be repeated.
- Courses may not be repeated if the purpose is to only revise final GPA's.

The preceding policy shall also apply for any course taken at the 9<sup>th</sup> grade level or above.
