

## CURRICULAR AND EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

### Curricular Activities

Curricular activities are those that are an integral part of the instructional program of the school. Examples of these would be: field trips taken in connection with classroom work, trips to cultural events, band festivals (concert adjudication), choral clinics, etc.

All curricular trips are subject to the approval of the Board. The trip must be carefully planned so as to insure the maximum in both safety and instructional values. Therefore, the teacher shall plan each proposed curricular trip carefully in cooperation with the principal and shall submit the request to the Superintendent at least two weeks prior to the date of the proposed activity.

### Extracurricular Activities

Extracurricular activities are those that are a regular part of the school program but are not an integral part of the instructional program. The principal examples of extracurricular activities are athletic, band, and club activities.

Modern educational programs create needs for students to travel from their home school for a wide variety of curricular and extracurricular activities. Whenever possible, students will be transported on school buses.

The Superintendent shall adopt and enforce reasonable regulations to implement state laws and State Board of Education and Board policies governing the use of school buses for curricular and extracurricular transportation. The Superintendent shall institute procedures for requesting the use of school buses and for recording and reporting such data as may be required for state reports. The Superintendent may budget funds for curricular and/or extracurricular transportation; and if such funds are not available or sufficient, he shall require the school and/or participants to pay part or all of the expenses for the driver and/or bus mileage as provided by policy.
